

More About Futnet

Unit 6 described a sport called futnet. Here are some more details about futnet:

- Futnet was originally invented in 1922 by soccer players in Prague, in the country that was then called Czechoslovakia. After becoming popular there, it spread to other European countries like Switzerland and France by Czech emmigrants in the 1940s.
- The first official futnet rules were created in 1940.
- Futnet was recognised as an official sport by the Czechoslovak Sports Organization in 1961.
- The first European Championships were held in 1991. The first World Championships were held in 1994, and recent participating countries include fifteen European countries, plus Canada, Costa Rica, South Korea, and the United States of America.
- Futnet can be played one-on-one, two-on-two, or three-on-three. The rules set a maximum number of times the ball can bounce and get kicked each time it crosses the net. For example, in a one-on-one game, the ball can be kicked twice and bounce once on each side before it must return to the other side.
- Although a futnet ball is similar in size to a soccer ball, it is different in that the panels are glued, rather than stitched, and a futnet ball is required to bounce at least half a meter (when dropped from one meter off the ground), which is generally bouncier than a soccer ball.
- A futnet set is won by whichever team reaches 11 points first. A match is won by winning two sets.
