

The Earth is shaped like a **sphere** or a ball. At the top is the North Pole. The area around the North Pole is called the Arctic.

At the bottom is the South Pole. The area around the South Pole is called the Antarctic. *Ant*- means opposite. The Arctic and the Antarctic are polar opposites.

Baby birds begin life in an egg. To get out of the egg, a baby bird must use its hatching tooth. A hatching tooth is a special bump on their beak used to break open the shell.


They move the hatching tooth back and forth inside the shell until it cracks. Do you see the hatching tooth?

There are eight kinds of bears in the world. All bears are large, powerful animals.



Bears have a short tail and five toes on each foot. All bears can stand up on their back legs.




# Foundations Carp Carp Unexpected Consequences






The carp **family** is the largest family of fish with over 2,400 **species** (spē shēz).

# Foundations Many Kinds of Feet





Different types of animals have different types of feet. Animals' feet are specially adapted to help them live in particular habitats, catch their prey, and get away from their predators.
